


Another year, another newsletter. Year, What year? Surely it's not a year since this last went to print! So what's happened? Keep reading.

Well it finally happened. I had been casting the net for a while looking for a move from Blayney. Nothing wrong with Blayney, but I thought it was time to move on.


May and June were a bit hectic, trying to get everything finished at work and on the house. Didn't really finish either.

Our house in Blayney is being rented out at the moment. The transfer of the loan was a long drawn out affair that will make us think twice before refinancing again.




Christening



Our house in Blayney is being rented which is great, hopefully the tenants enjoy it as much as we did.


Olga and Phil visited Blayney several times during the year to catch up, also lent a hand with the last minute renovations prior to the move, for which we are eternally grateful!


